

DU-KIT BOOKMARKS



Du-Kit is the easy to use, oven bake, modelling clay. The ideal material for making your own art works, craft items, decorations, jewellery, models, ornaments toys. Use your imagination to make colourful and complex art or stick to more easier designs.

You will need:

- Du-Kit Clay from Five Star Products
- Serviette with pattern
- Skewers
- Rolling pin (or cylinder to roll)
- Wax paper
- Cord (or string)
- Knife
- Elastic

These ideas below are great to giveaway as gifts!



PREPARING DU-KIT FOR USE

To prepare the Du-Kit for use, the clay needs to be conditioned by hand to make it soft and pliable. Break off small pieces at a time and work through your hands. Roll into a long snake, fold in half and twist together then roll into a ball. Repeat process until it is soft and workable.

Lets create:

TRANSFER PRINT BOOKMARK

Step 1: Flatten and roll out Du-kit white between waxed paper so it doesn't stick to roller. To get the desired even thickness, roll between 2 skewers or toothpicks. Cut to size and shape.



Step 2: Using a 3 ply serviette, remove the 2 bottom layers leaving just 1 layer with pattern. Cut pattern required leaving slightly bigger than clay shape - do 1 for each side of the bookmark.



Step 3: Gently press the serviette, pattern side to clay, using your finger tips. Place a piece of waxed paper over and in a circular motion keep rubbing the serviette making sure no air bubbles exist. Repeat for other side.

Step 4: Make a hole for the cord using a skewer (or circular cutter). Place on a tile or baking paper and bake at 130 degrees C for 1 hour in the oven.

Step 5: When completely cold, place in bowl of water & leave to soak for half an hour. With fingertips gently rub away the paper layer (this may take a little time to dissolve away). The serviette pattern will have transferred to the bookmark.

Step 6: Attach the cord through the hole.



MARBLED BOOKMARK

Step 1:

Condition the clay as per previous instructions for your 3 chosen colours, then roll equal quantities of each colour into 3 separate long snakes.



Step 2:

Now lay the 3 snakes together and twist, then roll with your hands to form one snake (dont make it too thin). Cut snake in half and twist together again. Repeat until desired marbled effect is created.



Step 3:

Follow steps 1, 4 and 6 to the left, to complete your bookmark.



BEADED BRACELET

Step 1: Using left over clay from marbled bookmark, roll into snake shape and cut even sized pieces and roll into small balls.

Step 2: Make a hole using a skewer or toothpick in each ball. Come in from both ends to make smooth hole.



Step 3: Bake as before for 1 hour at 130 degrees C. To stop beads from rolling off, make a fan shape in paper and place in grooves.

Step 4: Once the beads have cooled, thread onto elastic.
