This is a two component solvent free epoxy fairing compound/filler. It has excellent application properties, high strength, good sandability and minimal shrinkage during cure. To be used as part of a complete coating system in atmospheric and immersed environments. Suitable for properly prepared carbon steel and composite surfaces.

Typical use

Apply by trowel or fairing board to smooth-out (fair) surface deflections on metal or composite substrates of yacht exteriors.

Surface (touch) dry: The state of drying when slight pressure with a finger does not leave an imprint or reveal tackiness.

Walk-on-dry: Minimum time before the coating can tolerate normal foot traffic without permanent marks, imprints or other physical damage.

Dry to over coat, minimum: The shortest time allowed before the next coat can be applied.

Dry to over coat, maximum, atmospheric: The longest time allowed before the next coat can be applied.

Dried/cured for service: Minimum time before the coating can be permanently exposed to the intended environment/medium.
