Fabric: lightweight and soft – light to mid-weight linen, rayon, cotton or silk voile, cotton or velvet. Use non directional fabric because the skirt is cut on the cross-grain. Fabric that is 44 inches / 112cm wide requires that the Right Bodice piece be cut on the cross grain. Sizes: XS – 3X.
