Section: 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

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Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up : Stop leak if safe to do so. Flush away traces with water. For large spills, dike spilled material or otherwise contain material to ensure runoff does not reach a waterway.
